- Bible import, printing, ownership and distribution are restricted or not possible in many countries
 Poverty, especially in rural areas, prohibits Bible access
- Limited internet and smart phone access in rural, poor communities
 Security and privacy concern in numerous countries



An Overview of Bible access in Burkina Faso

Burking Faso's Christian population comprises nearly 6.2 million believers. slamic appression is the most dominant force restricting Bible access in Burkina Faso. Since 2016, jihadist groups such as Ansar ul Islam, JNIM, and Islamic State Sahel Province have launched violent efforts to "Islamize" the country, often through hamilic attacks specifically targeting Christians. In the past year alone:

- In Essakane (Feb 2024): Militants stormed a Catholic church during worship, killing
 15
- In Sanoba (Aug 2024): 28 Christian men were tied up and their throats slit in front of others gathered for a Sunday service.

In many cases, entire Christian communities are forcibly displaced, churches are burned, and converts from Islam are astractized or threatened with death. The use of roadblocks and checkpoints by militarits often results in Christians being identified and either kidnopped or executed on the spot.


